Looking Towards the Future

Greetings Melrose-Mindoro Community,

As we say goodbye to 2022, I hope you are off to a Happy New Year! As the district jumps into 2023, I want to take a moment to update our families & community members on a few items of importance.

The school board approved the final 2022-2023 school budget on October 24, 2022. The final budget included a tax levy of \$4,375,355 with a mill rate of 9.784. This is a decrease of 1.98% on the mill rate from the previous year. This is the lowest mill rate in 10 years, despite an approximate 9.25% increase in property value and the \$24.7 million dollar construction project completed in 2018. The school board and administration has focused on improving school facilities and academic programming, while being fiscally responsible.

The district has used one-time Federal ESSER (Covid-19) dollars to help fund many needed programs, with no additional cost to local taxpayers and parents. Like most school districts in the state of Wisconsin, the Melrose-Mindoro School District recognized the need for before and after school care to combat the childcare shortage. In the 2020-2021 school year, the district started providing after school care for PreK-3rd grade students. Then in 2021-2022 we expanded to include before school care and offered both times to PreK-6th grade students. We currently provide this care to students from **6:30-8:00 a.m.** and **3:15--5:30 p.m**. when school is in session. For the past three years, the numbers of students participating has nearly doubled each year. We currently average around 90-100 students attending before or after school care each day. Along with the increase in students participation, the cost of funding the program as increased to approximately \$40,000 per year. This is not a problem while we have remaining ESSER dollars to fund the program, but when this funding ends in September 2024, the district will need to look for other ways to fund the program. The district has looked into applying for state and federal grants but currently do not qualify for most of the programs being offered to school districts. As a last resort, the district may have to look at charging families a fee to utilize the before and after school program.

I am hopeful the state legislature and governor will use the surplus in the state budget to provide our district with adequate funding to maintain our current programming. Despite the uncertainties of school funding, the school district is committed to ensuring services are continued to help support students & families. Please stay tuned for more information as we navigate through these issues over the next few years. Again, thank you for your support.

Holocaust Survivor to Speak to Students and Community Members

Peter Feigl, the only child of Ernst and Agnes Bornstein Feigl, was born on March 1, 1929, in Berlin, Germany. His father, a mechanical engineer, worked for a multinational company selling automotive equipment throughout Europe while his mother stayed home to raise Peter in an upper middle class environment. When the family, who were non-practicing Jews, moved to Vienna in 1937, Peter was baptized in the Catholic Church in the hope he would be shielded from the virulent antisemitism in Germany and Austria.

Sixth grade teachers Mrs. Janet Woodward and Mrs. Becky Blaken will both be attending the Holocaust Workshop hosted by Viterbo University in March. Both teachers attended last year and came away with a plethora of knowledge to assist in teaching this valuable information. Due to their participation in the workshop, the Melrose-Mindoro 6th, 7th and 8th grade students will have the honor and privilege to hear Mr. Peter Feigl speak on March 24th. He is a Holocaust survivor. Mr. Feigl will also have a public presentation on Thursday, March 23, 2023 at 7:00 PM. We encourage you to take the opportunity to hear living history.



Regular Open Enrollment: February 6-April 28, 2023

Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend school districts other than the one in which they live. Applications may be submitted to up to three nonresident school districts.

The application period for the 2023-2024 school year is from February 6-April 28, 2023. **The application period closes at 4:00 p.m. on April 28, 2023.** Parents are encouraged to apply online at: http://dpi.wi.gov/oe

Once a pupil is accepted into a nonresident school district, the pupil may continue to attend that district without reapplication except that: A pupil may be returned to the resident school district if the special education required in a new or revised IEP is not available in the nonresident district or there is no space, or a pupil who has become habitually truant in the nonresident district may be returned to the resident district.

It's Cold Outside! Winter gear is necessary for warm, happy, healthy students. We have a supply of donated coats, hats, mittens, scarves, and snow pants. If your child is in need of warm clothing, please let a staff person know. If we do not have what your child needs, we will help find it. Students will have outside recess unless air or wind chill temperatures are zero or below as posted on the National Weather Service. This is monitored closely during the cold winter days.

REMINDER OF CRITERIA FOR KEEPING A STUDENT HOME FROM SCHOOL:

Temperature over 100*F by mouth/ear. Please do not send the student back to school until the temperature is normal for 24 hours without the use of a fever-reducing medication.

Severe cold with headache, chills, fever and stuffy or runny nose

Vomiting in the past 24 hours

A red sore throat with white spots, lasting more than 12 hours

An undiagnosed rash

Red blood streaked eyes that are mattered shut, itch, are swollen and hurt.

Diarrhea in the past 24 hours

Live head lice - may come after treated

COVID positive

If your student is not going to be attending school, please call (608) 488- 2201 or email the secretary at attendance@mel-min.k12.wi.us to let them know of the absence and the reason. Please also let your bus driver know.

HEAD LICE: If you have a concern about your child, let me know and I will discreetly check them. They do not jump or fly and do not like to leave the head they are on – unless they can move directly to another. If your child has long hair, please **style it pulled back or up.** When the children put their heads together working on projects, telling secrets, etc., the lice have the opportunity to move to another head.

Occasionally check your child after their bath or shower. If you have found head lice at home, please let me know, along with any other students that your child is in close contact with. This is kept confidential. You can find our complete head lice policy and treatment information on the school website.

HEALTH SCREENINGS: Vision: The Mindoro Lions Club partnered with La Crosse Lions to conduct the screening using a photoscreening digital device called a SPOT. It is like a large camera and takes a picture of your child's eyes. It has technology to detect a number of potential eye problems. Mid November, Early Childhood through 6th grades completed the screening. Letters have been sent home for children who need further evaluation. I can continue to vision screen students at parent or staff's request. **Hearing**: Our school district has an Audio Pilot screener that can be used to screen the hearing of any child that parents or staff have a concern about.

MEDICATION: Any medication at school requires a School Medication Form signed by the parent and be in the original container (no baggies). For prescription medication, the form must also be signed by the physician. Please contact me if you have questions or need assistance. Students are NOT allowed to carry or keep medication with them unless authorized by his/her physician.

MORE INFORMATION: I will occasionally post information on our district website. You can find me under the "schools" tab at "News From Our School Nurse". Dr. Elizabeth Hanson from Gundersen Onalaska Clinic is our district's Medical Advisor and much of the information I post comes from the Gundersen Clinic website.




A Not So Superstitious 'Friday the 13th' Celebration

ANNUAL NOTICE

HOMELESS CHILDREN AND YOUTH

The McKinney-Vento Act defines homeless children and youth as:

Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, and includes children and youth who are:

- sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason
- living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative adequate accommodations
- living in emergency or transitional shelters
- abandoned in hospitals
- living in a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings
- living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings; and migratory children who qualify as homeless because the children are living in circumstances described above.

If you are personally aware of or are acquainted with any children or youth who may qualify according to the above criteria, the Melrose-Mindoro School District provides the following assurances to parents and guardians of homeless children and youth and unaccompanied homeless youth:

- The child or youth shall be immediately enrolled and allowed to fully participate in school, even if unable to produce records normally required for enrollment (e.g., academic records, immunization and other required health records, proof of residency, or other documentation) or has missed application or enrollment deadlines during any period of homelessness.
- Homeless children and youths are not stigmatized or segregated on the basis of their status as homeless and have full
 and equal educational and related opportunities.
- Meaningful opportunities to participate in the education of their children including special notices of events, parent-teacher conferences, newsletters, and access to student records.
- Immediate enrollment and transportation to the school of origin. "School of origin" means the school that a child or
 youth attended when permanently housed or the school in which the child or youth was last enrolled, including a preschool.
- Written explanation of any decisions related to school selection or enrollment made by the school, the local educational
 agency, or the State educational agency involved, including the rights of the parent, guardian, or unaccompanied youth
 to appeal and receive prompt resolution of such decisions.


